INTENDED ACTION: Repeal Rules and Adopt New Rules

SUBSTANCE OF PROPOSED ACTION:

- To provide an option for individuals with a bachelor's or higher degree to become certified through the Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificate Approach.
- To recognize full-time secondary and/or postsecondary teaching experience in a prescribed program area as acceptable full-time work experience.
- To provide flexibility in certification by allowing individuals to be issued a renewable Specialty Area 2 Certificate after completing the five required education courses.
- To allow acceptance of a bachelor's degree in lieu of 36 of the required 45 semester hours of earned coursework for issuance of the Specialty Area 3 Certificate.
- To ensure that each level of certification requires submission of the occupational proficiency assessment to verify content knowledge and current industry proficiency levels.
- To allow the holder of a valid Professional Educator Certificate in a teaching field to add Career and Technical Education endorsements in selected technical education program areas or health science by demonstrating occupational proficiency (test scores, license, or credential) and verifying appropriate P-12 teaching experience.
- To allow individuals who have not met all requirements for a Career and Technical Specialty Area Certificate to be issued a one-year, non-renewable Temporary Certificate with an endorsement in a prescribed technical education program area.

290-3-2-.24 Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificate in Health Science Approach.

- (1) General Requirements for a Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificate in Health Science. A Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificate in health science may be issued when all general requirements and specific requirements for the program area of health science are met. The general requirements are:
- (a) A criminal history background check as required by the Alabama Child Protection Act of 1999, as amended, and Rule 290-3-2-.02(9).
- (b) Completion of all requirements prior to September 1 for a certificate bearing a July 1 effective date of a given year.
 - (c) Approval of the State Director of Career and Technical Education.

(2) Specific Requirements for the Issuance of a Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificate in Health Science.

(a) Type, Degree Equivalency, Valid Period, and Renewability.

- (b) Requirements for the Issuance of a Specialty Area 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 Career and Technical Certificate in health science.
- 1. Issuance of the <u>Specialty Area 1</u> Career and Technical Certificate in health science, which is valid for three years and is not renewable, requires <u>all</u> of the following:
- (i) A recommendation on Form CT from a superintendent who wishes to employ the applicant to teach in the program area of health science.
- (ii) An active Alabama license in a registered nursing, paramedical, or allied health specialty.

- (iii) Documentation of education and work experience through one of the following options:
- (I) Official transcript(s) verifying an earned associate's degree in a healthcare area from a postsecondary institution that was regionally accredited at the time the degree was earned and verification of having attained, within the seven years immediately preceding September 1 of the calendar year during which the certificate is to become valid, a minimum of 6,000 clock hours (three years) of acceptable full-time work experience as prescribed in Rule 290-3-2-.24(3).
- (II) Official transcript(s) verifying an earned bachelor's or higher degree in a healthcare area from a senior institution that was regionally accredited at the time the degree was earned and verification of having attained, within the three years immediately preceding September 1 of the calendar year during which the certificate is to become valid, a minimum of 2,000 clock hours (one year) of acceptable full-time work experience as prescribed in Rule 290-3-2-.24(3).
 - (iv) Approval of the State Director of Career and Technical Education.
- 2. Issuance of the <u>Specialty Area 2</u> Career and Technical Certificate in health science, which is valid for five years and is renewable, requires <u>all</u> of the following:
- (i) Eligibility to hold a Specialty Area 1 Career and Technical Certificate in health science.
- (ii) An active Alabama license in a registered nursing, paramedical, or allied health specialty.
- (iii) Completion of the appropriate Alabama Department of Education-approved New Teacher Institute.
- (iv) Official transcript(s) verifying earned credit with a grade of "C" or above in each of the following three courses at an Alabama institution with State-approved teacher education programs:
 - (I) Strategies for Teaching Special Needs Students in Inclusive Settings.
 - (II) The Evaluation of Teaching and Learning.
 - (III) Classroom Management.
- (v) Official transcript(s) verifying earned credit with a grade of "C" or above in the following two courses at an Alabama institution with a State-approved teacher education program in a career and technical education teaching field:
 - (I) Methods of Teaching Career and Technical Education.
 - (II) Learning Resources and Technology in Career and Technical Education.
- 3. Issuance of the <u>Specialty Area 3</u> Career and Technical Certificate in health science, which is valid for five years and is renewable, requires <u>all</u> of the following:
- (i) Eligibility to hold a Specialty Area 2 Career and Technical Certificate in health science.
- (ii) An active Alabama license in a registered nursing, paramedical, or allied health specialty.

 - (II) Option Two. Official transcript(s) verifying:
- I. At least an earned bachelor's degree from a senior institution that was regionally accredited at the time the degree was earned.
- II. Earned credit, with a grade of "C" or above, in the following three courses at an Alabama institution with a State-approved teacher education program in a career and technical education teaching field:

- (iv) Credit earned to meet requirements for the Specialty Area 2 Career and Technical Certificate cannot be applied toward the Specialty Area 3 Career and Technical Certificate.
- 4. Issuance of the <u>Specialty Area 4</u> Career and Technical Certificate in health science, which is valid for five years and is renewable, requires <u>all</u> of the following:
- (i) Eligibility to hold a Specialty Area 3 Career and Technical Certificate in health science.
- (ii) An active Alabama license in a registered nursing, paramedical, or allied health specialty.

- 5. Issuance of the <u>Specialty Area 5</u> Career and Technical Certificate in health science, which is valid for five years and is renewable, requires <u>all</u> of the following:
- (i) Eligibility to hold a Specialty Area 4 Career and Technical Certificate in health science.
- (ii) An active Alabama license in a registered nursing, paramedical, or allied health specialty.
- (iii) Official transcript(s) verifying an earned master's or higher degree in a healthcare area from a senior institution that was regionally accredited at the time the degree was earned.
- (3) Acceptable Full-Time Work Experience. Acceptable full-time work experience must have been attained through one or more of the following:
- (a) Work experience in the healthcare industry <u>as an employee</u> in a compensated position as a healthcare practitioner. The experience must be verified with submission of:
 - 1. Supplement CT EV; and
- 2. A notarized cover letter verifying the applicant's prior work experience. The cover letter must be on the employer's business/company stationery and must include at least a description of the nature of the business/company, a brief description of the scope and quality of the applicant's work history, and the original signature of the employer or owner of the business/company.
- (b) <u>Self-employment</u> in the healthcare industry as a healthcare practitioner. The experience must be verified with submission of:
 - 1. Supplement CT EV; and
- 2. A notarized cover letter on company stationery, a copy of each business license held during the verification period, and notarized letters from three individuals and/or companies with which business or work transactions occurred during the verification period.
- (c) Teaching experience at the secondary and/or postsecondary level in health science. The experience must be verified on Supplement EXP.
- (4) Conversion of a Type Career and Technical Certificate to a Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificate.
- (a) An applicant holding a valid Type II or III Career and Technical Certificate in health science seeking a higher level Career and Technical Certificate in health science must meet requirements for the Specialty Area 1 Career and Technical Certificate in health science as a prerequisite to the Specialty Area 2, 3, 4, and 5 Career and Technical Certificates in health science.

- (b) An applicant holding an expired Type II or III Career and Technical Certificate in health science who is seeking a current Career and Technical Certificate in health science must meet requirements for the Specialty Area 1 Career and Technical Certificate in health science as a prerequisite to Specialty Area 2, 3, 4, or 5 Career and Technical Certificates in health science.
- (c) Type I Career and Technical Certificates in health science were issued on the basis of the Rules in effect prior to July 1, 1997. Prior to January 1, 2008, at the request of the certificate holder, a valid Type I Career and Technical Certificate in health science was converted to the appropriate Level 4 or 5 Career and Technical Certificate in health science as determined by the State Director of Career and Technical Education. Type I Career and Technical Certificates in health science cannot be renewed. An individual holding an expired Type I Career and Technical Certificate in health science who is seeking a current Career and Technical Certificate in health science must meet requirements for the Specialty Area 1 Career and Technical Certificate in health science as a prerequisite to Specialty Area 2, 3, 4, or 5 Career and Technical Certificates in health science.

(5) Conversion of a Level Career and Technical Certificate to a Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificate.

- (a) Upon application to the Office and approval by the State Director of Career and Technical Education, an applicant holding a valid Level 4 or 5 Career and Technical Certificate in health science may be issued the appropriate Specialty Area 3, 4, or 5 Career and Technical Certificate in health science.
- (b) An expired Level 1, 2, and 3 Career and Technical Certificate in health science cannot be reinstated. An applicant holding an expired Level 1, 2, or 3 Career and Technical Certificate in health science who is seeking a current Career and Technical Certificate in health science must meet requirements for the Specialty Area 1 Career and Technical Certificate in health science as a prerequisite to Specialty Area 2, 3, 4, or 5 Career and Technical Certificates in health science.
- (6) Valid Period. Information about the valid periods of Specialty Area Career and Technical Certificates in health science is in the chart in Rule 290-3-2-.24(2)(a).

(7) Implementation Information.

- (a) Specialty Area 2 Career and Technical Certificates in health science.
- 1. Prior to August 1, 2012, the Specialty Area 2 Career and Technical Certificate in health science, valid for five years, was issued as a nonrenewable certificate.
- 2. Effective August 1, 2012, the Specialty Area 2 Career and Technical Certificate in health science, valid for five years, may be renewed. Renewal requirements are prescribed in Rule 290-3-2-.33.
