1. NEED/EXPECTED BENEFIT OF RULE:

Examination fees will be collected by the national examination organization. Fees will no longer be collected by the licensing board. Current fees charged for the national examinations exceed those allowable to be charged by the Board.

The Alabama Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors is statutorily required to operate as a self sustaining Board and relies on examination fees and licensure fees for revenue to provide for the operation of the Board. Not being able to charge for the total cost of the examinations caused the Board to operate at a loss. The Board was operating only as a throughput for the monies.

2. COSTS/BENEFITS OF RULE AND WHY RULE IS THE MOST EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT, AND FEASABLE MEANS FOR ALLOCATING RESOURCES AND ACHIEVEING THE STATED PURPOSE:

Applicants will pay the national organization directly for the cost of the national examinations. The Board's budget will be decreased since the earmarked monies will not be collected. The Board staff will not have the workload associated with the collecting of monies. A contract between the national organization and the Board will no longer be required as the only monies being paid to the national organization will be membership fees.

3. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COMPETITION:

4. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COST-OF-LIVING AND DOING BUSINESS IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED:

Impact will be the same state wide and has an inconsequential impact of the costs of living and doing business.

Those individuals taking the examinations will be responsible for paying the full amount of the examinations. Licensees' renewal fees will not have to be increased to cover the deficiencies in exam revenue.

8. UNCERTAINTIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ESTIMATED BENEFITS AND BURDENS OF THE RULE, INCLUDING QUALITATIVE/QUANTITATIVE BENEFITS AND BURDEN COMPARISON:

The difference in the amount collected and owed for the examinations varies with the number of exam takers. This causes uncertainties as to the deficit amount that the Board has to assume.

10. DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC HEALTH IF THE RULE IS NOT IMPLEMENTED:

If the Board can not collect all monies required to cover the cost of the examinations, other fees will have to be increased including corporate and individual renewals. These increases could be passed on to their clients as the cost of doing business.
