### ALABAMA FORESTRY COMMISSION ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

## CHAPTER 390-X-7 STATE FOREST VISITOR REGULATIONS

390-X-7-.08 Prohibited Devices.

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person other than a duly authorized law enforcement officer to possess or carry into any State Forest or any property owned by the Forestry Commission any form of firearm without written permission of the manager in charge of the State Forest visited, except those areas designated as a Wildlife Management Area or Handicapped Hunting Area in conjunction with the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and then only firearms for the appropriate hunting season. No person shall possess, discharge, ignite, or otherwise set off on or within a State Forest any firecrackers, torpedoes, rockets, cap pistols, sky lanterns (also known as Chinese lanterns), or any other fireworks.

(2) All automobiles, ice chests, coolers or other containers that enter into any state forest are subject to inspection by any Forestry Commission law enforcement officer or other employees authorized by the State Forester for prohibited devices and alcoholic beverages. For purposes of this regulation, "prohibited devices" shall include, in addition to alcoholic beverages, all fireworks of any kind and any firearm except as provided in Section 1 of this rule. Any person that refuses to allow inspection of the above named articles shall be in violation of this regulation.
