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810-5-1-.227.04 Memorandum of Understanding Between the Department of Human Resources and the Department of Revenue. (REPEALED)

- (1) The Department of Revenue may allow access into the Department's motor vehicle registration and certificate of title databases to the Alabama Department of Human Resources. The purpose of this access is limited to assisting the Department of Human Resources in carrying out its functions in regard to the Food Stamp, Family Assistance, Medicaid for Low Income Families, and Child Support Enforcement programs.
- (2) The Department of Human Resources agrees to be responsible for the access and dissemination of data by personnel within its department. The Department of Human Resources agrees to require its personnel to sign a Disclosure Statement acknowledging that the use of the data is to be confined solely to the legitimate administration of its programs. Personnel within the Department of Human Resources are to be advised that use of such data for other purposes could be a violation of the federal Driver's Privacy Protection Act; also, that the improper use of the information could constitute a violation of the Alabama Computer Crime Act.
