CHAPTER 480-4-3

BENEFITS

480-4-3-.09 Claims And Registration For Individuals Located In Isolated Areas. REPEAL

In order to claim benefits or waiting period credits for total or part-total unemployment, any individual located in an isolated area served only by the itinerant service of the Alabama Unemployment Compensation Agency shall report in person to such itinerant service representative at the first available opportunity and file a claim for benefits. In order to establish eligibility for waiting period credits or for benefits for weeks of unemployment thereafter, the claimant shall continue to file claims for benefits in accordance with Rule 480-4-3-.08.
