335-7-14-.05 Additional Reporting Contents.

- (1) The following subparagraphs govern the reporting information regarding the Groundwater Rule contained in rule 335-7-5-.22: (a) Any ground water system that receives notice from the Department of a significant deficiency or notice from a laboratory of a fecal indicator-positive ground water source sample that is not invalidated by the Department under rule 335-7-5-,22(5)(d) must inform its customers of any significant deficiency that is uncorrected at the time of the next report or of any fecal indicator-positive ground water source sample in the next report. The system must continue to inform the public annually until the Department determines that particular significant deficiency is corrected or the fecal contamination in the ground water source is addressed under rule 335-7-5-.22(6)(a). Each report must include the following elements: The nature of the particular significant deficiency or the source of the fecal contamination (if the source is known) and the date the significant deficiency was identified by the Department or the dates of the fecal indicatorpositive ground water source samples. If the fecal contamination in the ground water source has been addressed under rule 335-7-5-.22(6)(a) and the date of such action. For each significant deficiency or fecal contamination in the ground water source that has not been addressed under rule 335-7-5-.22(6)(a), the Department-approved plan and schedule for correction, including interim measures, progress to date, and any interim measures completed. If the system receives notice of a fecal indicator-positive ground water source sample that is not invalidated by the Department under rule 335-7-5-.22(5)(d), the potential health effects using the health effects language of Appendix C of this division. If directed by the Department, a system with significant deficiencies that have been corrected before the next report is issued must inform its customers of the significant deficiency, how the deficiency was corrected, and the date of the correction under subparagraph (6)(a) of this rule. Any system required to comply with the Level 1 assessment requirement or a Level 2 assessment requirement that is not due to an E. coli MCL violation must include in the report the text found in paragraph (2)(a) and paragraphs (2)(b) and (2)(c) of this section as appropriate, filling in the blanks accordingly and the text found in paragraphs (2)(d) of this section if appropriate.
- Coliforms are bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially harmful, waterborne pathogens may be present or that a potential pathway exists through which contamination may enter the drinking water distribution

- system. We found coliforms indicating the need to look for potential problems in water treatment or distribution. When this occurs, we are required to conduct assessment(s) to identify problems and to correct any problems that were found during these assessments.

- (3) Any system required to conduct a Level 2 assessment due to an *E. coli* MCL violation must include in the report the text found in paragraphs (3)(a) and (3)(b) of this section, filling in the blanks accordingly and the text found in paragraphs (3)(c) of this section, if appropriate.
- (a) E. coli are bacteria whose presence indicates that the water may be contaminated with human or animal wastes. Human pathogens in these wastes can cause short-term effects, such as diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a greater health risk for infants, young children, the elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems. We found E. coli bacteria, indicating the need to look for potential problems in water treatment or distribution. When this occurs, we are required to conduct assessment(s) to identify problems and to correct any problems that were found during these assessments.
- (b) We were required to complete a Level 2 assessment because we found *E. coli* in our water system. In addition, we were required to take [INSERT NUMBER OF CORRECTIVE ACTIONS] corrective actions and we completed [INSERT NUMBER OF CORRECTIVE ACTIONS] of these actions.

(c) Any system that has failed to complete the required assessment or correct all identified sanitary defects, is in violation of the treatment technique requirement and must also include one or both of the following statements, as appropriate:
1. We failed to conduct the required assessment.
2. We failed to correct all sanitary defects that were identified during the assessment that we conducted.
(4) If a system detects <i>E. coli</i> and has violated the <i>E. coli</i> MCL, in addition to completing the table as required in paragraph 335-7-1404(3)(d) and (e) of this section, the system must include one or more of the following statements to describe any noncompliance, as applicable:
(a) We had an <i>E. coli</i> -positive repeat sample following a total coliform-positive routine sample.
(b) We had a total coliform-positive repeat sample following an <i>E. coli</i> positive routine sample.
(c) We failed to take all required repeat samples following an <i>E. colipositive</i> routine sample.
(d) We failed to test for <i>E. coli</i> when any repeat sample tests positive for total coliform.
(5) If a system detects <i>E. coli</i> and has not violated the <i>E. coli</i> MCL, in addition to completing the table as required in paragraph 335-7-1404(3)(d) and (e) of this section, the system may include a statement that explains that although they have detected <i>E. coli</i> , they are not in violation of the <i>E. coli</i> MCL.
