the minimum continuing medical education requirement by reason because of illness, disability, or other circumstances beyond his control may apply to the Board of Medical Examiners for a waiver of the requirement for the calendar year in which such illness, disability or other hardship condition existed. A waiver may be granted or denied within the sole discretion of the Board of Medical Examiners, and the decision of the Board shall not be considered a contested case and shall not be subject to judicial review under the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act. If a waiver is granted, the physician is exempt from the continuing medical education requirement for the calendar year in which the illness, disability, or other hardship condition existed.
