100-X-2-.02 Registration by Examination. An applicant for registration by examination shall submit an application fee as provided by regulation. The Board shall set qualifications and review, or cause to be reviewed, each candidate's qualifications. The Board shall require proof of qualifications prior to allowing candidates to sit for the Architect Registration Examination® (ARE®). The Board may approve an applicant to take the ARE® only after the applicant has completed the education requirements for architectural registration by examination in Alabama, has completed at least six (6) months of full-time-930 hours of approved Intern Development Program (IDP) experience working under the direct supervision of an architect licensed in a U.S. or Canadian jurisdiction in an organization engaged in the lawful practice of architecture, and has submitted the required application materials. Upon determination that the applicant is qualified in accordance with the Board's statutes and regulations, the applicant will be granted eligibility for the examination. Upon successful completion of all examination divisions and completion of the Intern Development Program, the applicant will be granted registration as an architect.
