281-1-1-.01 Definitions.

- (1) Unless otherwise defined herein, the definitions of terms set forth in Act 2001-975 of the 2001 3rd Special Session are incorporated by reference herein.
- (2) As used in this chapter, the phrase "documentaries, videos, commercial, print industrial productions" means productions for national or regional presentations with expenses exceeding \$100,000.
- (3) As used in this chapter, the term "feature length motion picture" means either of the following:
- (a) A film with a budget of \$500,000 or more and 100 percent of the film is shot in Alabama.

- (b) A film with a budget of not less than 1,000,000.
- (4) As used in this chapter, the term "qualified film" means a production intended for theatrical release of a feature length motion picture or for exhibition on national television by a network or through national syndication, documentaries, videos, commercial, print, or industrial productions produced for commercial use.

281-1-1-.02 Film Notification. The Director of the Alabama Film Office shall be notified, either orally or in writing and prior to actual production concerning whether a production company for a qualified film will be locating within the State and that the production company for the qualified film intends to claim exemptions pursuant to Sections 40-23-4, 40-23-62, and 40-26-1, Code of Ala. 1975.

281-1-1-.03 Application For Certificate; Supporting Documentation.

- (1) On or after December 1, 2001, a production company for a qualified film that films in the State may apply to the Alabama Film Office for certification to qualify for sales and use tax exemption pursuant to Section 40-23-4 and 40-23-62, Code of Ala. 1975, and lodging tax exemption pursuant to 40-26-1, Code of Ala. 1975.
- (2) The applicant shall submit to the Alabama Film Office a Film Certification Tax Exemption Form (FCTE). The form shall be

available from the Alabama Film Office or by downloading an application from the Alabama Film Office's website.

281-1-1.04 Examination, Notification, And Appeal.

- (1) The Alabama Film Office shall analyze the application and the supporting documentations to determine whether the following requirements are met:
- (a) The proposed qualified film provides a significant and positive economic impact on the state.
- (b) The proposed qualified film produces sufficient revenues and public demand to cover the costs of production in the State.
- (c) The proposed qualified film utilizes to the extent reasonable under the circumstances, Alabama resource including, but not limited to, employees, contractors, equipment, materials, and supplies.
- (d) The proposed qualified film furthers the comprehensive economic development strategy plan promoted by the state and state agencies.
- (2) The Alabama Film Office shall inform the applicant in writing of whether the production company is an approved company. If the applicant is an approved company, the Director of the Alabama Film Office shall certify the Form FCTE as approved. The certification of the form by the Director of the Alabama Film Office shall constitute a binding written agreement between the approved company and the Film Office.

The Alabama Film Office shall notify the applicant in writing if an application is denied. The Director of the Alabama Film Office shall explain in writing the reason or reasons for the denial. The applicant may seek a reconsideration of its application within 30 days from receipt of the notification from the Office.
