## 420-5-7-.24 Outpatient Services.

- (1) If the hospital provides outpatient services, the services shall meet the needs of the patients in accordance with acceptable standards of practice.
- (2) Organization. Outpatient services shall be appropriately organized and integrated with inpatient services.
  - (3) Personnel. The hospital shall:
  - (a) Assign an one or more individuals to be responsible for outpatient services; and
- (b) Have appropriate professional and nonprofessional personnel available <u>at each location</u> where outpatient services are offered, based on the scope and complexity of outpatient <u>services</u>.
