1. NEED/EXPECTED BENEFIT	OF RULE:	

The Alabama Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors is statutorily required to operate as a self sustaining Board and relies on examination fees and licensure fees for revenue to provide for the operation of the Board. The Board desires to convert from annual renewals to biennial renewals and to delete the requirement for interns and those licensees in retired status from having to renew. The amount

2. COSTS/BENEFITS OF RULE AND WHY RULE IS THE MOST EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT, AND FEASABLE MEANS FOR ALLOCATING RESOURCES AND ACHIEVEING THE STATED PURPOSE:

Renewal increase of \$55 reflects a doubling of the annual renewal plus a small increase to offset the loss of other revenues. The Licensure Fee increase is due to the fact that a license will now be issued for a maximum of 2 years instead of 1. The reinstatement fee structure was changed to reflect the biennial renewal conversion. The changes enable the Board to remain self-sufficient without tax dollars or General Fund monies and avoids a budgeting crisis.

The Board is setting the intern and retiree renewal fees at \$0 until the requirement for renewals of those categories can be deleted from its licensure law.

3. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COMPETITION:

None

4. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COST-OF-LIVING AND DOING BUSINESS IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED:

Impact will be the same state wide and has an inconsequential impact on the costs of living and doing business.

5. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON EMPLOYMENT IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED:

The licensees have requested the conversion to biennial renewal to assist them with their internal record keeping. We are one of six comparable licensing boards throughout the U.S. that are still on an annual renewal cycle. The vast majority of licensing boards previously converted to 2 and 3 year renewal cycles. The licensees like it and the board sees a workload and expense decease.

6. SOURCE OF REVENUE TO BE USED FOR IMPLEMENTING AND ENFORCING THIS RULE:

No additional costs involved to implement.

7. THE SHORT-TERM/LONG-TERM ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THIS RULE ON AFFECTED PERSONS, INCLUDING ANALYSIS OF PERSONS WHO WILL BEAR THE COSTS AND THOSE WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE RULE:

Licensees will bear the costs through modest increase in the licensure and renewal fees. Licensees will benefit by having to renew every 2 years instead of every year. The staff will benefit by not having the costs associated with and the workload involved in renewing 18,000+licensees every year. Licensees and consumers will benefit from the Board being able to maintain the same level of needed staffing and services.

8. UNCERTAINTIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ESTIMATED BENEFITS AND BURDEBNS OF THE RULE, INCLUDING QUALITATIVE/QUANTITATIVE BENEFITS AND BURDEN COMPARISON:

The number of licensees renewing remain somewhat constant. The decrease in revenue by not requiring the retired licensees to renew is a small fraction of the recognized revenue. The associated costs of requiring the interns and retirees to renew was larger than the revenue received. The Board is anticipating that everyone will be on the same renewal cycle requiring the staff to budget for a 2-year cycle since the majority of revenue recognized is from the renewals. The majority of monies received will be at the beginning of the 2-year cycle while expenses will be for two fiscal years.

SUBSTANCE OF AMENDMENT: The Board proposes to amend the fee structure in order to convert to biennial renewal cycle. The amendment deletes the fee for intern renewal/reinstatement and the fee for maintaining a license in retired status. Licensure fees and renewal fees are increased since the license will now be valid for two years instead of one. The reinstatement fees are changed to reflect the change in the renewal cycle.
