### 220-2-.115 Snagging or Snatching-Fish-on-the-Tennessee River

- (1) For the purpose of this regulation, "snagging" It shall be unlawful to take fish ondefined as the Tennessee Rivertaking or its impoundmentsattempted taking of fish by pulling either a single hookor group of hooks through the water in any manner which increases the likelihood of impaling fish in body regions other than the mouth (snagging or snatching), provided said hooks may be so used with bait and/or-lures to entice fish to strike or bite such bait or lure.
- (2) It shall be unlawful to take or attempt to take fish by snagging on all waters of the Tennessee River or its impoundments.
- (3) It shall be unlawful to take or attempt to take fish by snagging within 800 feet of any dam on the Coosa River or its impoundments.
