1.	NEED/EXPECTED BENEFIT OF RULE: This rule amendment will enable the board to meet its mission of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public by remaining solvent.
2.	COSTS/BENEFITS OF RULE AND WHY RULE IS THE MOST EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT, AND FEASIBLE MEANS FOR ALLOCATING RESOURCES AND ACHIEVING THE STATED PURPOSE: All funds expended by the board for its operations are self-generated through the collection of fees from the licensees. The cost increase per licensee is minimal but it is the only means the board has for raising revenue to meet its operational costs.
3.	EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COMPETITION: The Alabama Board of Physical Therapy is the sole regulatory board for physical therapists and physical therapist assistants. There is no competition.

4.	EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COST-OF-LIVING AND DOING BUSINESS IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED: The effect of this rule on cost-of-living and doing business is minimal in the geographic area where this rule is to be implemented.
5.	EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON EMPLOYMENT IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED: This rule has no apparent effect on employment in the geographical area where the rule is to be implemented.
6.	SOURCE OF REVENUE TO BE USED FOR IMPLEMENTING AND ENFORCING THIS RULE: The source of revenue to be used for implementing and enforcing this rule is the fees collected from the board's licensees.
7. DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC HEALTH IF THE RULE IS NOT IMPLEMENTED: Failure to implement this rule would result in the board being unable to meet its financial obligations and therefore preclude it from regulating those persons providing physical therapy services in the state of Alabama.
