304-X-107 Cease and Desist Orders
(1) The Board may conduct inspections relative to the operations of
unlicensed persons to ensure lawful compliance.
(2) If the Board has information relative to a person's unlawful
activity, conduct or practice, the Board may issue an order for the person to show cause
why an order should not be issued directing the person to cease and desist from the
activity, conduct, practice or the performance of any work being done or about to be
commenced,
commenced,
(3) If the person who receives an order from the Board files a written
request for a hearing before the Board within 14 days after receipt of the order, the Board,
not less than thirty days thereafter, shall hold a hearing on the matter.
(4) After a hearing, or if no hearing is requested, the Board may issue a
Cease and Desist Order in the name of the State of Alabama under the seal of the Board.
(5) If the person to whom the Board directs a Cease and Desist Order
does not cease or desist the prescribed activity, conduct, practice or performance of the
work immediately, the Board may petition any court of competent jurisdiction to issue a
writ of injunction enjoining the person from performing the work.
(6) Upon a showing by the Board that the person has engaged or is
engaging in any work prohibited by the Board's law, the court shall grant injunctive relief
enjoining the person from engaging in such unlawful activity.

(7) Upon the issuance of a permanent injunction, the court may fine
the offending person up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000), plus costs and attorney fees for
each offense, and may be rendered in the same judgment in which the injunction is made
absolute.
(8) Any person violating this Board's law who fails to cease work after
a hearing and notification from the Board shall not be eligible to apply for a license from
the Board for a period of one year from the date of official notification to cease work.
(9) The Board may also withhold approval for up to six months of any
application from any person who prior to the application has been found in violation of
this Board's law.
