1. NEED/EXPECTED BENEFIT OF RULE:
To update existing rules related to Avian Influenza to prevent and respond to a potential outbreak of Avian Influenza.
2. COST/BENEFITS OF RULE AND WHY RULE IS THE MOST EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT, AND FEASIBLE MEANS FOR ALLOCATING RESOURCES AND ACHIEVING THE STATED PURPOSE:
The proposed rules are to most cost effective as to protect the public and the poultry industry from Avian Influenza.
3. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COMPETITION:
The effect of this rule on competition will be minimum since it applies to all poultry within the state and being imported into the state.
4. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON COST-OF-LIVING AND DOING BUSINESS IN THE
GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED: The effect, if any, of this rule would be minimal.

5. EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON EMPLOYMENT IN THE GEORGRAPHICAL AREA WHERE THE RULE IS TO BE IMPLEMENTED:

The effect, if any would be minimal.

6. SOURCE OF REVENUE TO BE USED FOR IMPLEMENTING AND ENFORCING THIS RULE:

Existing revenue in the Department will be utilized for implementing and enforcing these rules.

7. THE SHORT-TERM/LONG-TERM ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THIS RULE ON AFFECTED PERSONS, INCLUDING ANALYSIS OF PERSONS WHO WILL BEAR THE COSTS AND THOSE WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE RULE:

If there is a short-term impact it will be minimal. In the long-term, this rule will provide a possible economic impact as protecting the poultry producers of this state from effects of Avian Influenza.

8. UNCERTAINTIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ESTIMATED BENEFITS AND BURDENS OF THE RULE, INCLUDING QUALITATIVE/QUANTITATIVE BENEFITS AND BURDEN COMPARISON:

Any minimal burden associated with these rules are small in comparison to the risk and devastation that Avian Influenza can bring to the state in absence of these rules.

- 9. THE EFFECT OF THIS RULE ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC HEALTH: These rules will ensure that poultry producers are able to supply consumers with wholesome disease free poultry.
- 10. DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC HEALTH IF THE RULE IS NOT IMPLEMENTED:

Without these rules, producers may not be able to supply consumers with wholesome and disease free poultry and the Department will not be able to adequately respond to an outbreak of avian influenza.

80-3-18-.02 Prohibition Against Entry Into Alabama. All live poultry, their hatching eggs, and the used coops, containers, flats, or other accessories, and the vehicles or other means of conveyances used in the handling of live poultry or their hatching eggs, originating from or in transit through any area quarantined due to Avian Influenza, anywhere in the United States, are hereby prohibited entry into or transportation through the State of Alabama without prior written permission from the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries, or his agents.

All poultry, including but not limited to hatching eggs, chicks, poults, poultry breeding stock, gamebirds, exhibition and hobby farm poultry moving into Alabama for exhibition, show, sale, change of ownership or any other purpose, that are not participating in the Pullorum-Typhoid(PT) Clean and Avian Influenza (AI) Clean programs of the National Poultry Improvement Plant (NPIP) shall be tested negative for PT and AI using an approved serology or antigen detection test or other test approved by the state veterinarian within 21 days prior to movement.

All poultry, including but not limited to hatching eggs, chicks, poults, poultry breeding stock, gamebirds, exhibition and hobby farm poultry moving into Alabama must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) or a NPIP Form 9-2 or NPIP Form 9-3 with test results included on form.
