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**INTENDED ACTION:** Repeal and New

**SUBSTANCE OF PROPOSED ACTION:** The department proposes to repeal the above rule in its entirety and replace it with new language and new title. The new language will provide that beginning January 1, 2013, license plate issuing officials shall not process a vehicle registration transaction without receipt of satisfactory evidence of insurance or verification of mandatory liability insurance.
